

INTERSECTIONS

- Make sure the student cross checks every intersection, even when the light is green.
- Teach students to stop for a full 3 seconds at the white line, before the stop sign, or at the end of double yellow lines.
 - Explain when to use a double stop, as necessary.
- Make sure the student is stopping the vehicle completely first, then looking left, right, left.
 - Stopping for a full 3 seconds making sure the odometer reads "0". Explain why they should not roll through the stop sign while looking over your shoulder.
- Demonstrate looking both ways even when turning onto a one-way street.
- Explain why they should never change lanes when passing through intersection(s).
- When making a left turn across oncoming traffic:
 - Make sure the student is keeping the steering wheel straight until the traffic clears.
 - Explain to the student why they need to always turn into the closest lane.
- Make sure the student knows that pedestrians always have the right of way.
- Explain/demonstrate that when two roads are one-way streets, you can make a left on red.

TURNING

- Demonstrate the shuffle technique vs. hand over hand steering. Make sure the student brings the wheel back after a turn instead of letting it slide back.
 - For students that have trouble with the shuffle technique, take them into a parking lot and have them keep their hands at the top of the wheel and practice by using small movements until they feel more comfortable.
- Remind students to "look through the turn".
 - Make sure they are looking through the turn not just glancing to make sure the lane they are crossing is clear, but also that the road they intend to enter/turn onto is not obstructed.
