EMERGENCY ITEMS THAT SHOULD ALWAYS BE IN YOUR TRUNK

First Aid Kit: Choose a kit that has significantly more items than you'll probably ever need because being overly prepared comes in handy. Suggested items for a first aid kit include a variety of bandages, gauze pads, antibiotic ointment, antiseptic wipes, non-latex gloves, and scissors.
